2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

During the session 2017-18, IQAC initiated several measures for quality.

All the major committees of the college in coordination with IQAC continuously worked for the holistic growth of the institution. The IQAC shouldered the responsibility of generating and promoting awareness regarding quality enhancement in the institution.

The following major contributions were made by the IQAC:

- To motivate the teachers to organize workshops and seminars to promote research publications. Consequently the number of publications increased during the session.
- IQAC suggested to conduct Faculty development programmes.
- IQAC proposed to organize National seminars and conferences during the next session.
- Formation of Healing Touch Counselling Club alongwith usual counselling sessions to address the personal, social and psychological problems of the students.
- Cleanliness drives and creating awareness regarding usage of renewable energy sources to meet power requirements and to make environment pollution free.
- To strengthen extension and outreach activities.
- Continuous indulgence of IQAC towards making teaching and learning digital.
- The number of Value added courses to be increased in the next session.
- The members of the IQAC decided to regularly visit all the departments to ensure quality.
- The IQAC suggested that a language lab should be established in the college.
- IQAC proposed that the faculty should identify the advanced and slow learners and take the remedial measures accordingly.

The efforts of IQAC helped in overall quality enhancement.

On 09.03.2018, the club organized a workshop on Miracles of Meditation for the students to make them aware about the benefits of meditation - specifically chakra healing meditation.





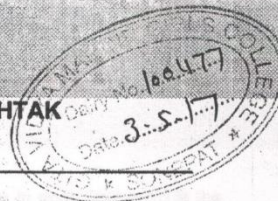
